

Andrew Galuska is the Director of Music and Fine Arts at the Community Church of Vero Beach, Florida. He has won prizes for organ performance and improvisation in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Texas, and abroad. His teachers have included Berj Zamkochian, Stephen Martorella, Robert Bates, and Clyde Holloway; he has studied French organ literature with Daniel Roth and Olivier Latry. Mr. Galuska has studied organ performance and conducting at the Nazarian Center for the Performing Arts, Rhode Island College; the Moores School of Music, University of Houston; and the Shepherd School of Music, Rice University. Mr. Galuska's repertoire spans six centuries with a particularly strong affinity for the masters of Romantic and 20th century music.

Mr. Galuska's active career as a solo artist, choral and orchestral conductor, collaborative artist, composer, adjudicator, media host, and lecturer takes him throughout the United States and abroad. He is frequently invited to appear at conferences sponsored by the Organ Historical Society, the American Guild of Organists, the American Baptist Conference, the United Church of Christ Conference, and the United Methodist Conference.

Mr. Galuska's commercial recordings include two tracks on Organs of New England-an anthology of organs and organists, released in 2013. The Organ Works of Franz Liszt was released Spring 2016 and features the great organ of Metropolitan UMC in Detroit, MI. Sleepers, Wake— a recording of Lessons and Carols-was released in 2009. In November of 2008 he recorded Dominick Argento's Jonah and the Whale with the Boston Modern Orchestra and the Providence Singers. He has recorded four selections for Pipes Rhode Island (RIAGO); Stereophile Magazine voted the recording a "Record to Die For."

A Word of Welcome

Welcome to the Episcopal Church of Bethesda-by-the-Sea for this special evening of prayer, contemplation, and song. If you are visiting with us this evening, we are especially delighted you have joined us and bid you a warm welcome.

The service of Evensong, or sung Evening Prayer, is sometimes called "the crown jewel of Anglican liturgy" as it is based almost entirely on Scripture and generously bequeathed with the rich legacy of the choral tradition. Some of the language will take us away from the mundane, offering a moment to reflect on our part among the countless generations who pray before and after us. Some responses will be sung between the Officiant and the Choir; the Congregation joins in singing the hymns, the Apostles' Creed, and the Lord's Prayer. Your active participation in the italicized portions of the prayers is a blessing to all of us.

The Lessons read at Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer are part of a two-year cycle containing all of Holy Scripture. Likewise, prayer at Bethesda continues daily, and you are warmly invited to join us for Morning Prayer at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesdays through Fridays, for Holy Eucharist at 12:05 p.m. on Wednesdays, on Sunday mornings at 8:00, 9:00, & 11:00 a.m., and for 4:00 p.m. Evensong on the first Sunday of the month. Please know that there is always a place for you at Bethesda-by-the-Sea.

The First Lesson

1 John 1:1–7

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us— we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.


A Prayer of St. Chrysostom


