NICENE CREED

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*

ABOUT ALL SOULS' SUNDAY

Each year on November 2 the Church throughout the world celebrates All Souls' Day, also known as The Commemoration of All Faithful Departed. All Souls' Day is a continuation of the previous day's All Saints' Day celebration. The first feast recalls the great saints of the Church, while the second recalls those we have known and love and lost in our own day. In parish churches All Saints' Sunday is generally marked on the first Sunday after November 1. At Bethesda-by-the-Sea, we mark All Souls' Sunday the following weekend. The liturgy begins with the opening anthem of the burial rite, spoken in procession. We then read the names of parishioners' loved ones who have died within the past year, and pray for those we remember on our hearts. While All Saints' Sunday is a great celebration, often with baptisms, All Souls' Sunday takes on a more somber tone with the reading of the necrology.
